In 1995 our travel schedule was, more or less, as follows.


- (Bukittinggi)
- Sipirok, hotel Torsiboni
- Lake Toba, Samosir Island at Tuk Tuk: hotel Silintong (four nights)
- via Pematang Siantar (hotel Siantar) to Medan, hotel Sumatra Village (four nights)
- Bohorok
- (back to Bali)

The trip was a wonderful one. Landscapes were breathtaking. Beautiful Dutch colonial as well as more modern Batak architecture can be found everywhere. The same goes for historical sites like those on Samosir Island (see the slide show). Much colonial heritage is present in Medan and partly well kept. However there is always a lot of rain on Sumatra.

Between 1850 and 1900 Batak area was brought under Dutch supervision. A part of this area accepted Christian faith. Most Sumatrans are Muslims. In Deli - around Medan, northern part of "Batak country" - a Dutch planter, Nienhuys, went into the hinterland and opened a Dutch plantation to grow tobacco (eastern bank Deli river, near Medan's Esplanade). Chinese and Indonesian coolies were shipped to Sumatra from 1870 on. Consequence was a rapid grow of Medan with houses, Chinese temples, mosques and churches. In 1870 Medan was still a small village. Now in 2008 the population is 2.500.000.

Under Dutch supervision Deli was a sultanate until 1950. A part of the royal family was murdered by Indonesian nationalists in 1945 in a most brutal way: they were cut into pieces. The family still lives in Maimoon Palace. In 1888 the family moved from Labuhan Deli to Medan.






Resident's Residence, Medan 1912






Head Office Deli Maatschappij, Medan 1920




Post Office, Medan 1930







