

I Hotel der Nederlanden, now Bina Graha, in Batavia – Jakarta during the Dutch Period Dirk Teeuwen MSc, Holland

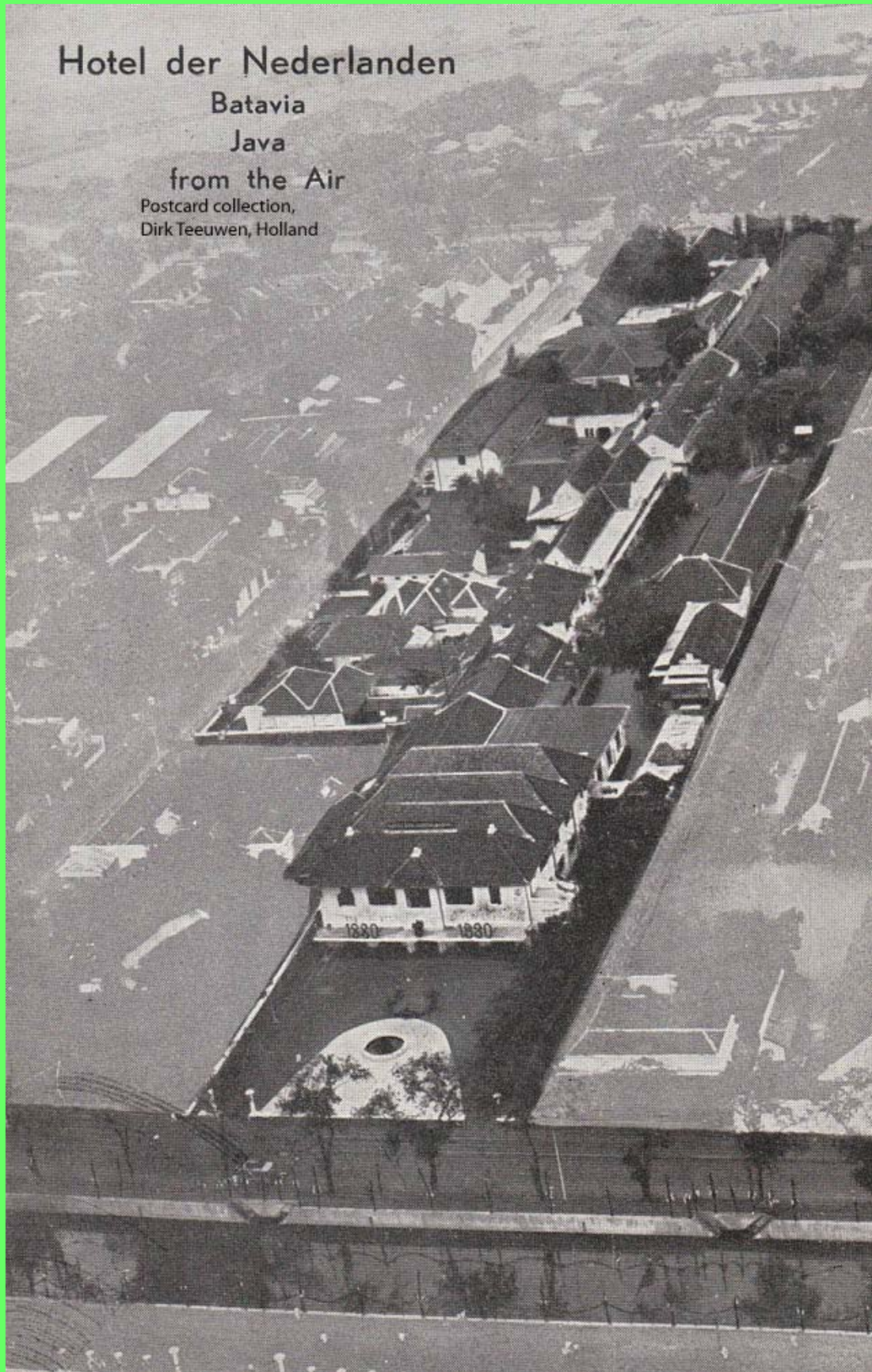

Hotel der Nederlanden has been demolished in 1969. The new building on this location is now Bina Graha (Presidential Office). In 1794 Pieter Tenzy lived here in his residence and so did Willem Hendrik van Eijsseldijk from 1799 as well as Governor General Thomas Stanford Raffles from 1811- 1815. In 1840 the building was renovated into Hotel Palais Royale, from 1846 Hotel der Nederlanden and from 1958 until 1969 Hotel Dharwa Nirmala resp. Hotel Markas Cakrabirawa.

The main lobby of the hotel was along Noordwijk (Jalan Ir. H. Juanda) and a second one along Koningsplein (Medan Merdeka). The parcel of the hotel was (and is) located directly east from the Paleis van de Gouverneur Generaal (the Presidential Palace). The parcel of the Presidential Palace stretches out between Jl Ir Juanda and Medan Merdeka also, that goes without saying.



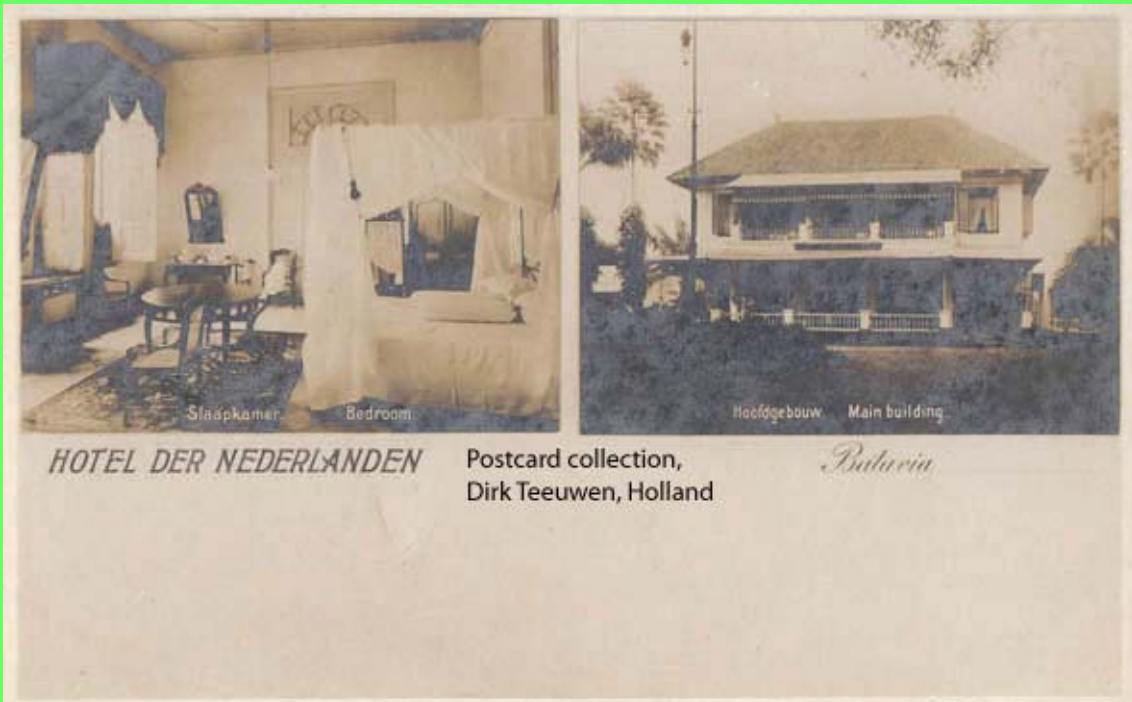
1. Hotel der Nederlanden, circa 1925

3. Dining room and entrance along Koningsplein (Medan Merdeka), circa 1910

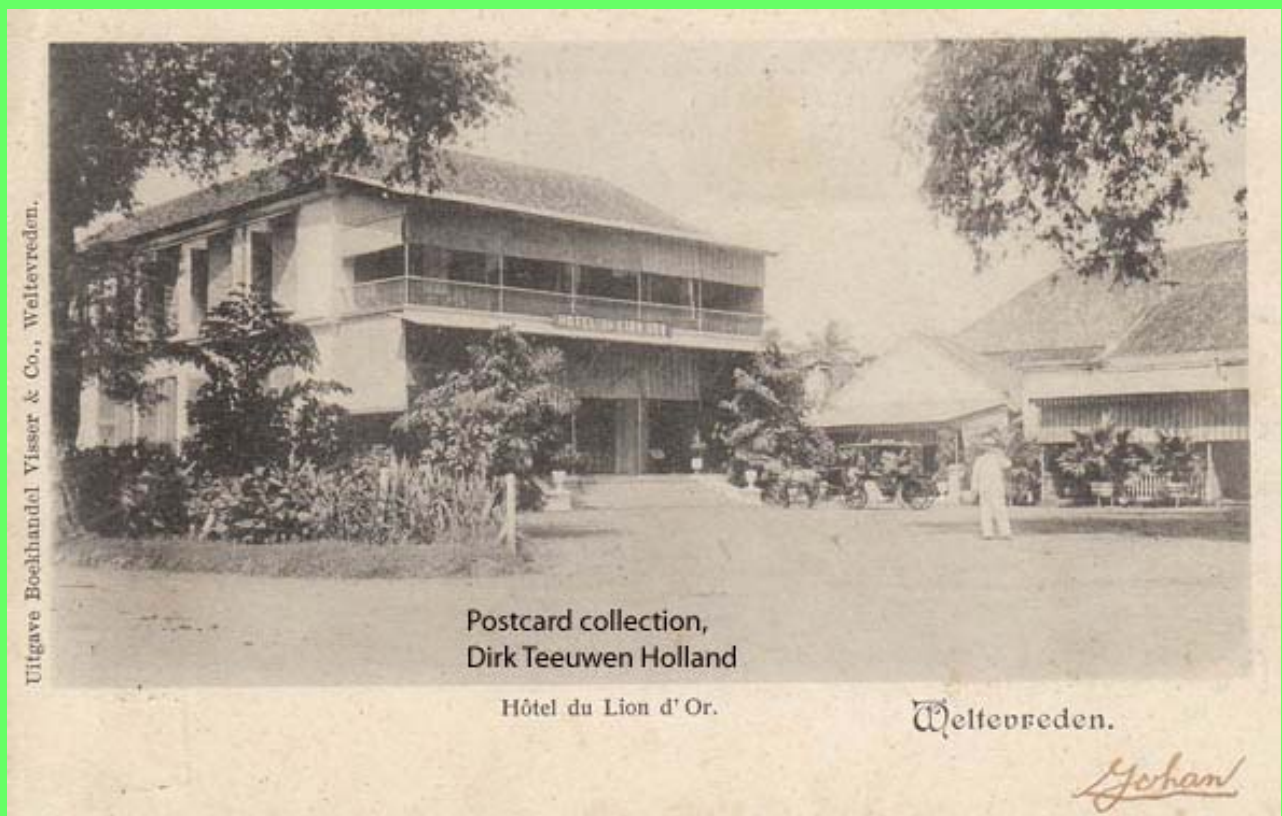


4. Guest room and main entrance along Noordwijk (JI Ir. Juanda)

II Hotel Du Lion d'Or, Dirk Teeuwen MSc

Corner Noordwijk (JI Ir. Juanda) and Citadelweg

On this location Hotel Cavadino was built in 1863. Then the name changed in Lion d'Or (French, means Lion in Gold) in 1899. After that it became Park Hotel in 1941 and Hotel Sriwijaya in 1950 until today. In the olden days the hotel was famous because of its ice creams.
